## **Step #2: Gale Virtual Reference Library = e-books** **Does not count as a print source but can be a source**

Login ID: wildcats

Areas to Use: Located in the **Gale Student Resource Center**. Select the “**Virtual Reference Library**” do not use the top “Find” box –you want to keep your e-books separated from your databases. Simply conduct a “basic search” for your topic.


Citation: Information is at the end of the article.

## **Step #3: Databases**

Use the databases located on the webpage <http://lhwildcats.org/content/library-home>. If you are accessing the databases from home you will need to use the username and passwords provided.

<b>ABC-CLIO:</b>	
Username: libertyville	Password: wildcats
Areas to Use:	Click on the “All Databases” or select the specific one. Apply the filters on the left-hand side after the initial search.
Citation:	MLA citation is at the end of the article.

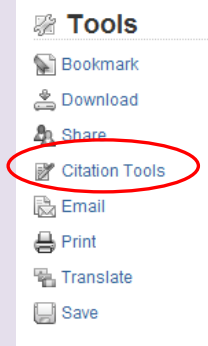



<b>EBSCOHost</b>	
Username: libertyville	Password: wildcats
Areas to Use:	<p>Magazine, Newspaper, Health, Images, Bios, etc. Click on “select all.” Do a basic search then click the “full text” box to refine your search.</p> <p>If using the “Student Resource Center” you will need to create your own citation.</p>
Citation:	<p>Use the “cite” icon that is on the right-hand side of the page under “Tools.”</p> 



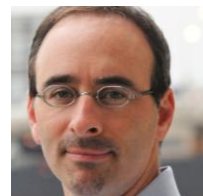
<b>Facts on File</b>	
Username: libertyville	Password: wildcats
Areas to Use:	Click on the “American History” or “World Geography & Culture Online”.
Citation:	Information is at the bottom of the article. Be sure it is in the correct MLA form.

<b>Gale Resource Center</b>	
Login ID: wildcats	
Areas to Use:	Select the “US History in Context” or “Global Issues in Context.” Do a basic search for your topic.
Citation:	Click on the “citation tools” in the “Tool” bar on the right-hand side. Select the MLA 7 <sup>th</sup> edition, and follow the instructions.



<b>NewsBank:</b>	
Username: lmslibrary	Password: wildcats
Areas to Use:	May click on the bold “Chicagoland Newspapers” at the top to search all the papers listed or select the one you prefer. Be sure to have ‘ <b>best matches first</b> ’ highlighted.
Citation:	Click on the “Bibliography Export” on the right-hand side and then select the “MLA Citations” button. Citation is in the 7th Edition MLA. 

<b>Proquest History Center</b>	
Username: lmslibrary	Password: wildcats
Areas to Use:	Select “Proquest Historical Newspapers (graphical).” Do a basic search and be sure to have “ <b>most relevant articles</b> ” highlighted.
Citation:	Information is at the top before the article—will need to create the citation.



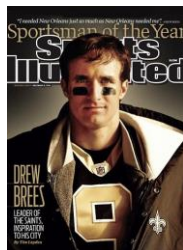
## Step #4: Internet Use

Use the Internet wisely. Websites ending in .edu, .gov, .org or .net are usually trustworthy—avoid .com unless approved by your teacher.

Set up a good internet search when you use **Google** <http://www.google.com/>. Remember to use the “+” and “-” symbols to narrow down the search.

For example: Beyonce  
Beyonce +”Destiny’s Child” -com +edu

Another search engine option is **Yippy** <http://search.yippy.com/>. This engine categorizes sites on the left-hand side.
