### Understanding Citation:

- ❖ Works Cited is an alphabetical list of works you quoted from, or works you referenced in the paper. Works Cited uses MLA (Modern Language Association) style.

\*Citation information can be found via the On-Line Catalog. Add the book title to “[add to this list](#)”, then click “[in this list](#)” (right-hand side); finally, click “[Go](#)” at the bottom of the page next to the Citation tab.

## Step #2: Gale Virtual Reference Library = e-books

Login ID: wildcats

Areas to Use: Located in the **Gale Resource Center**. Click on the appropriate area for your search, or simply conduct a “basic search.”

Citation: Information is at the end of the article. Or click on “source citation” button to take you to the location of the citation.

## Step #3: Databases = Electronic Sources

### ABC-CLIO:

User name: libertyville

Password: wildcats

**Areas to Use:** Click on the “American Government” and “American History” or select the “All” box. Be sure to read the category to prevent needless clicking or select a filter option on the left-hand side of the page.

**Citation:** MLA citation is at the end of the article.

### Annals of America:

User name: libertyville

Password: wildcats

**Areas to Use:** On the Home Page just make a general search. All documents are primary sources

**Citation:** MLA citation is at the end of the article.

### EbscoHost

Use the online access to subscriptions of magazines such as *Time*, *Newsweek*, etc.

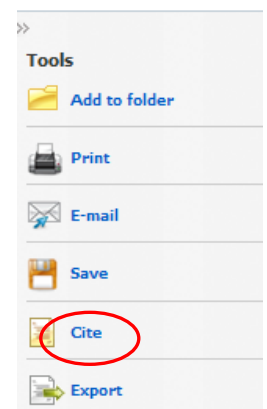
Login: libertyville

Password: wildcats

**Areas to Use:** Magazine, Newspaper, Health, Images, Bios, etc. Click on “select all.” In left-hand margin, select either “HTML Full Text” or “PDF Full Text”.

If using the “Student Resource Center” or “Points of View” you will need to create your own citation from the information provided.

**Citation:** Use the ‘cite’ icon on the right-hand side of the initial page under “Tools”.

**Areas to Use:** Click on “American History Online” Check out the tabs to see how the information is organized.

**Citation:** Information is at the end of the article in Chicago Style. Click on “How to Cite” for example of how to place the information into the MLA 7th Edition Style.

## Gale Resource Center:

Login ID: wildcats

**Areas to Use:** Select the “Opposing Viewpoints”. Simply do a basic search or click ‘advanced’ for only “full text” options. Be sure to check out the choices on the left under “Everything” including the ones for websites, as shown below.

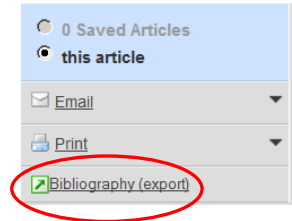
## Newsbank:

**Username:**  
libertyville

**Areas to Use:** May click on the bold “America’s News” at the top or select specific ones—place date parameters for recent materials if needed. Be sure to have ‘*best matches first*’ highlighted.

**Citation:** Click on the “Bibliography Export ” on the right-hand side and then select the “MLA Citations” button. Citation is in the 7<sup>th</sup> Edition MLA style.



## Step #4: Internet

### On-Line Journals:

#### History News Network

Read news articles that relate history to the present and learn historians' views of current events. Includes articles from the left and right. <http://www.historynewsnetwork.com/>

#### The Nation Magazine:

Discusses political and social questions. Keep scrolling down to find the topics. Once you click on the topic, the article appears at the same spot—so you'll have to scroll back down again.

#### Reason Magazine

Provides a provocative mix of news, analysis, commentary, and reviews. Will give more on the effects of an event than the actual history of the event. <http://www.reason.com/>
