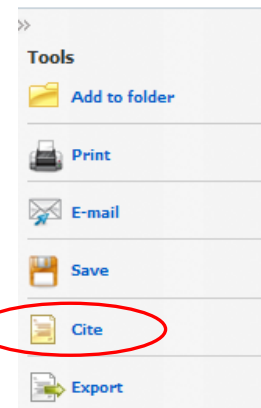

Areas to Use: Do a basic search. Sort by date or view the options in the left-hand box titled “Narrow your results”.



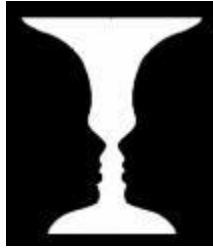
Citation: Click “Citation” on the right hand side -- must change the format to APA.
