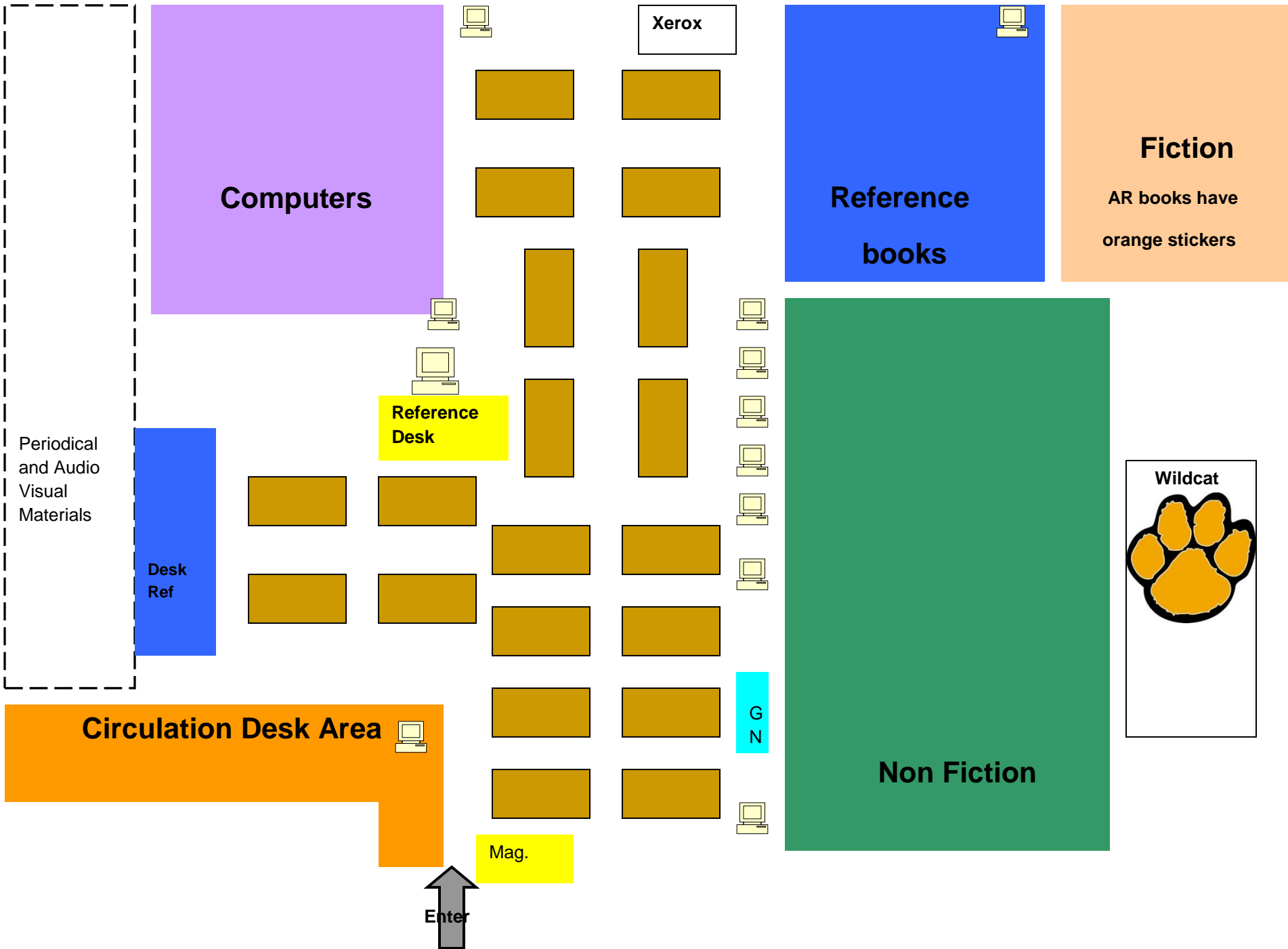

D. LHS Database "Cheat Sheet"

ABC-CLIO (History-U.S., World, Geography-U.S. and World, American Gov't)

Username: libertyville **Password:** wildcats

Area to Use: Click on the "All" tab for the easiest search.

Citation: MLA citation is at the bottom of the article.

Access Science ([Science sources](#))

Login: libertyvillehs **Password:** wildcats

Areas to Use: Select a topic or do a basic search. You will need to click on the article name in order to access the entire text.

Citation: Information is at the end of the article. Click “See MLA or APA” for examples of the 7th Edition MLA style. You will need to be sure it is the correct form.

Annals of America: ([Primary documents of American History](#))

Login ID: libertyville **Password:** wildcats

Areas to Use: On the Home Page just make a general search. Resist using only the ‘author’ search since your person may not have written anything.

Citation: Information is at the bottom of the article and must be placed in MLA format.

CQ Researcher: ([International coverage of current topics in the news](#))

User Name: libertyville **Password:** wildcats

Areas to Use: Generate a basic search. Click the arrow at the date tab for most current articles to be listed first.

Citation: Click on the “Cite Now” tab, then select “MLA Style” for the 7th Edition format.

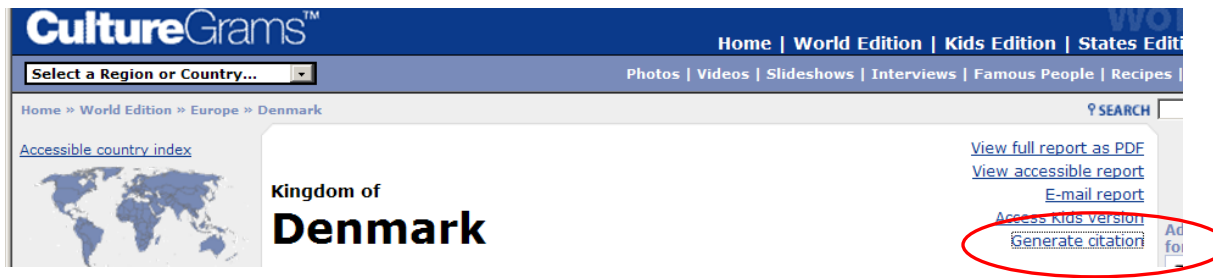
CultureGrams: ([Geographical data](#))

User Name: libertyville

Password: wildcats

Areas to Use: Select the appropriate edition and then the proper area and/or country.

Citation: Click on the “Generate Citation ” tab, for the MLA 7th Edition Style format.



EbscoHost (Full-text, book reviews, primary sources, etc.)

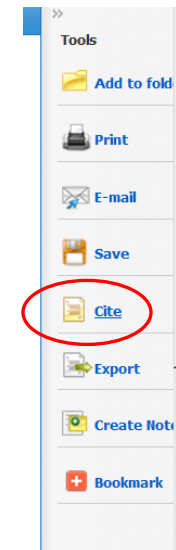

Password: wildcats

Areas to Use: Do a basic search but be sure to check the “full text” box. Click the ‘sort by’ to **relevance**.

If using the “Student Resource Center” or “Points of View” you will need to create your own citation from the information provided.

Citation: Ignore the citation button-use the icon that says “cite”.




Facts on File (Geography and History)

Username: libertyville **Password:** wildcats

Areas to Use: Click on the areas that best covers your topic. Be sure to use the tabs showing other options (see below). Also, read the descriptor to the right of the title to ensure you do not waste time on unwanted materials.

Areas to Use: Click on the areas that best covers your topic or do a basic search. Be sure to use the tabs other options (see below). Also, read the descriptor to the right of the title to ensure you do not waste time on unwanted materials.

Citation: Information is at the bottom of the article. Click on “How to Cite” to see examples done as MLA. Citation must be created.

FirstSearch ([Multiple databases & subjects, both articles and books](#))

User Name: 100107316 **Password:** wildcats

Areas to Use: Click on “Articlesfirst” in the upper, left-hand corner—always check the “full text” box (not as useful in 2011 as in the past). Could restrict the years to for the most current information.

Citation: The citation information is done and found under the tab “External Resources: Cite This Item.” Select the proper form. See the illustration below.

Citation: Information is at the end of the article. Be sure to place it in the correct MLA format.

Lexis/Nexis: (Legal & news sources; statistics, charts and tables)

Web ID: lnslibrary

Password: wildcats

Areas to Use: Study separate search areas (general, wires, transcripts) carefully to select which is best for your research. Be sure it is sorted by relevance.

Citation: Information is usually at the beginning of the article and you will have to generate your own citation.

Newsbank: (Chicago Trib, Sun Times, Daily Herald, NY Times)

Username: libertyville **Password:** wildcats

Areas to Use: May click on the bold “America’s News” at the top to search all the papers listed, or select a region or specific newspaper. Be sure to have ‘*best matches first*’ selected.

Citation: Click on the “Bibliography Export ” on the right-hand side and then select the “MLA Citations” button for the 7th Edition.

ProQuest History Center (CultureGrams, historic newspapers)

Login ID: libertyville **Password:** wildcats

Areas to Use: Select the appropriate product for your search.

Citation: “Citation/Abstract” tab is at the top of the page or use information at the top of the article. Citation must be created.

Password: library

Areas to Use: Do a basic search. Be sure to include the ‘full text’ selection.

Citation: Click on the “Article Citation” tab on the left-hand side of the page for the information. You must be sure it is in the proper form.

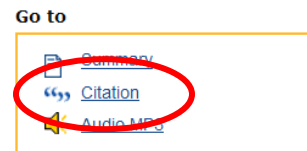

4) Internet Use:

A) Tips for Advanced Research

1. Less is more

- Use trustworthy sites ending in: .edu, .gov, .org or .net
 - Use Plus + operator to find a keyword in a document
“rap music” + “harmful lyrics”
“stem cell” + “moral issues”
 - Use Minus - operator to eliminate a word in a document
“Vikings” - “Minnesota”
“stem cell” + “moral issues”-.com (this will eliminate any .com websites)
 - Use site: This restricts the results to websites using that ending.
“Stem Cell” + “Moral issues” site:org (will pull up only *org* sites)
“Vikings” – “Minnesota” site:edu (will pull up only *edu* sites)
 - Use intitle: This restricts the results to documents containing the first word in the title and the second word in the document.
[intitle:music harmful]-com
[intitle:Eleanor Aquitaine] site:edu

**Note: There is no space from the colon and the first word after it and brackets are used around the entire query.*

- Use inurl: This restricts the results to documents containing the first word in the url and the second in the document.
[inurl:music harmful] site:gov
[inurl:Eleanor Aquitaine]-com

**Note: There is no space from the colon and the first word after it and brackets are used around the entire query.*

B) Evaluating Webpages

1. Criteria to use when evaluating a web site.

Authority—who wrote it? Are they experts?

Purpose—what is it for? Is it to inform, persuade, or entertain?

Currency—when was it made?

Accuracy—is the information correct?

Presentation—is the page arranged so it makes sense? Is it easy to use? How does it look?
