Login ID: wildcats

Areas to Use: Located in the **Gale Resource Center**. Click on the appropriate area for your search or simply conduct a “basic search”—be sure that tab is highlighted.

Citation: MLA citation is at the bottom of the e-book article or click on the “citation tools” in the “Tool” bar on the right-hand side. Select the MLA 7th edition, click ‘download’ and then ‘open.’

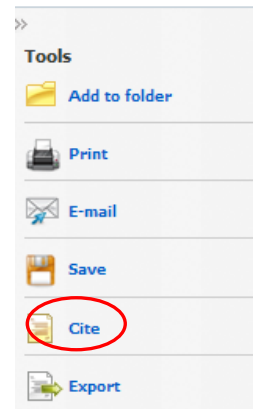

Areas to Use: Magazine, Newspaper, Health, Images, Bios, etc. Click on “select all.” Do a basic search. After the results come up, check on the “full text” box to filter the results then the HTML or PDF is on the left-hand side.

If using the “Student Resource Center” you will need to create your own citation.

Citation: Use the icon that says “cite” that is on the right-hand side of the page under “Tools”.

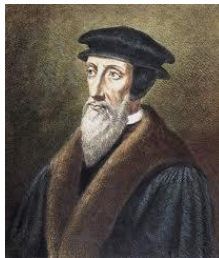

Search Engines:

Google or <http://scholar.google.com/>

Use the Internet wisely. Set up a good internet search when you use Google. Websites ending in .edu, .gov, .org or .net are usually trustworthy. Remember to use the “+” and “-” symbols to narrow down the search.

For example: Italian Renaissance
“Italian Renaissance” +artists –.com +.edu

Martin Luther
“Martin Luther” +95 Theses -.com +.edu

Age of Exploration
“Age of Exploration” –space –.com +Portugal
